Scholarship Types

Merit-based Scholarship

- Granted solely based on a student's outstanding academic achievement (financial need is not considered).

Need-based Scholarship

- Granted based on a student's demonstrated financial need

Female Scholarship

- Reserved specifically for academically qualified female students who have demonstrated financial need.

Other Scholarship Types

- Employer-sponsored scholarship for employee students
- Endowment funds

BITS Scholarship Fund

- BITS College provides financial aid awards to help students pay for an undergraduate or graduate degree;
- A scholarship can be awarded in a one-time check, or can be renewable each semester;
- Scholarship funds may come from various sources including clubs, charities, foundations, businesses, employers or individuals
- Scholarships are administered by BITS College.



Contribution Methods/ Denominations

- Simply make a one-time contribution from Birr 10,000 up to Birr 25,000 to a scholarship pool created for the purpose. Such donations may be made from time to time. These contributions are combined to create a scholarship award for students.
- Consider funding: one course per semester for a student, one semester courses for a student, one year (two semesters) courses for a student, one degree-program (eight semesters) courses for a student.
- Consider establishing a named permanently endowed scholarship fund in honor of someone. A minimum of Birr 75,000.
- Consider making a pledge - if one is not able to donate immediately, pledges may be made overtime for payments within an academic calendar year.



Reporting Procedures

- Contributors will receive an official fund receipt from BITS College.
- The College will follow an objective and transparent screening process in awarding and administering scholarships. Such procedures will be published and shared.
- An appropriate system will be implemented to monitor the use of funds following disbursement.



Scholarship Fund Administration

- The scholarship fund administration team has a fiduciary responsibility to donors to ensure that funds are utilized in accordance with the agreed upon terms and conditions in respect of each donation.
- Scholarship disbursements will be in accordance with the applicable rules and regulations and this will be monitored for consistency.
- Disbursement requests are subject to an independent review, and may not be approved if there are procedural violations.
- Scholarship funds have authorized signatories who are individuals designated to approve expenditures from the scholarship fund. Signatories shall not be involve in the scholarship candidate selection and awarding processes.
- For better management, each type of scholarship fund shall have its own unique fund account in the BITS College chart of account.



Scholarship Award Process Highlights (via High Schools)

- Sending official requests to high schools for nominations
- Reviewing nominations and contacting students
- Reviewing applications submitted and preparing recommendations
- Conducting selection meetings and deciding on the award
- Notifying the recipient about the award
- Signing respective agreements
- Notifying donors about the award
- Referring the case to respective college units for execution
